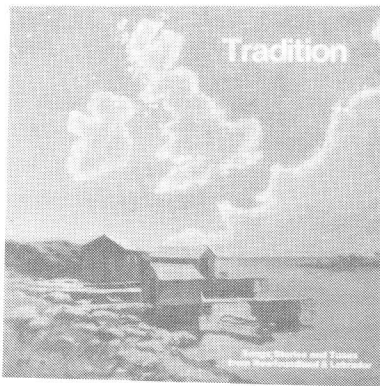

Songs (Mostly Traditional): Newfoundland

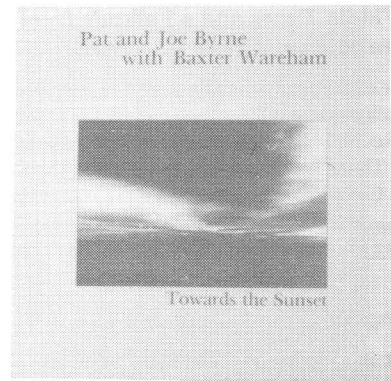

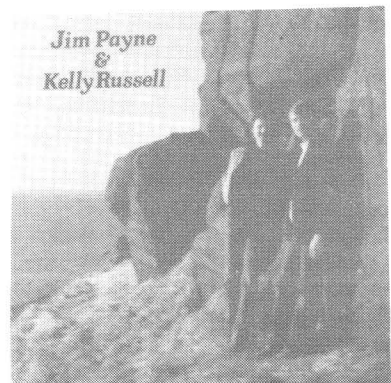
A collection of new songs written in traditional style and performed by well-known Newfoundland artists. There is some very biting commentary on social issues.

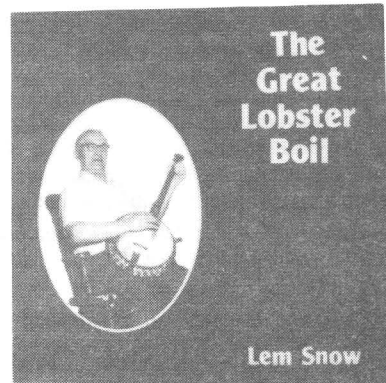

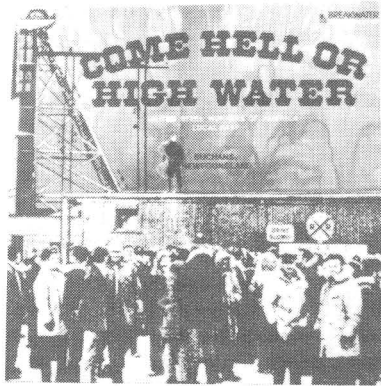
Folk Songs of Newfoundland sung by Alan Mills

Come Hell or High Water: Songs from the Buchans Miners Strike of 1973

Chronicles the songs composed around a bitter series of strikes that occurred in the early 1970's. The songs (there is also a recitation and a tune) reflect the Newfoundland traditions but with new words related to the strike. The liner notes provide good contextual information about the strike and the miners who performed the material.

Twelve songs and one story selected from the 600 Leach collected in Newfoundland in 1950-51. Includes some fine traditional singers with both local and Irish material. The folk tale is about the sealing vessel "Newfoundland," and there are two interesting ballads about Franklin.

Songs of the Newfoundland Outports

Between 1951 and 1961 Kenneth Peacock made numerous visits to Newfoundland recording in many communities around the island. He subsequently published a mammoth, three volume collection (National Museum, 1965). The album, "Songs of the Newfoundland Outports," presents a selection of songs from Peacock's field tapes. For the first time you will hear some of these songs sung as they were when originally collected. The incredibly fine singing and marvellous songs are testimony to the vital and rich folk song traditions of our easternmost province. Documentation is by Kenneth Peacock and Edith Fowke, production by Kelly Russell.
